Around the Day Program A recent movement group focused on rhythm. Participants discussed how rhythm can create a sense of togetherness among a group. Two participants established a rhythm with drums and the rest of the group created movements and danced to the rhythm.

In a spirituality group, participants discussed the meaning of spirituality and shared the following personal definitions of spirituality:

- Belief in something; that which gives people purpose and meaning in life
- Kindness and helping other people
- That someone's watching
- Being kind, helpful and available
- Not trying to know all the answers
- Giving sufficient time and energy to accept someone just as they are
- Not doing for others; helping draw others out to be who they are

From Mind Matters—Early Memory Loss Program
As part of a recent focus theme on remembering names, the group participated in a dance/
movement therapy group that combined remembering names with identity and movement. The group went around the room and shared



their name and a personal movement. Then, each person shared attributes of their identity and together the group developed a comprehensive movement reflecting the

various personal characteristics. The group ended with a dance party.

Two University of Illinois Extension Master Gardeners gave a presentation on herbs. The Master Gardeners discussed the many uses of herbs, and how to grow, harvest, dry and store them. Group members passed around different herbs and discussed how they smelled and how

they might be used in recipes. The group worked together to cut herbs and put them together into bouquets garnis.




dedicated to giving back. On Tuesday, November 27, people and organizations around the world will come
